#### F. CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Carleton's Chief Officer Report was read and submitted.

One particular highlight is that the burn pile that was created after the widespread storm damage in December is scheduled to be attended to by District volunteer firefighters over the three day period (if necessary) of March 22, 23 and 24, 2019.

Additionally, the Darley mini-pumper is still being outfitted with equipment and is expected to be in service in April, after which a dedication ceremony will be scheduled and advertised.

Chief also reported that the upstairs renovations are expected to commence very soon. A check has been received from the insurance company in the amount of \$6,800 from the flooding damage that occurred in the bathroom. There are potential additional contingency funds available from the insurance company if necessary. The chosen contractor will be asked if he is willing to accept volunteer labor for the renovation process from the District volunteer firefighters in hopes of keeping costs contained.

Chief announced that PROBUS organization has invited the Chief to speak to its members on Wednesday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, at the Coast Hotel in Tsawwassen.
